ESA have been asked if we would like to provide feedback on Application <u>1385 - Shared Medical Appointments (SMAs) for</u> <u>Type 2 Diabetes Management</u>. This has been discussed by the Medical Affairs Sub-committee and decided that rather than ESA having a formal position, we would open this up for interested members to give their feedback as individuals. The protocol for Application <u>1385 - Shared Medical Appointments (SMAs) for Type 2 Diabetes Management</u> is now available for public comment.

If you would like to provide feedback on the draft protocol please complete the feedback form which can be found <u>here</u>. You are welcome to provide feedback from either a personal or a group/organisation perspective for consideration by the Protocol Advisory Sub-committee (PASC). The feedback form should take 10-12 minutes to complete.

The data collected will be used to inform the Medical Services Advisory Committee (MSAC) assessment process to ensure that when application 1385 is assessed for public funding in Australia, that it is patient focused and achieves the best value. Please be aware that responses will be provided to MSAC, its subcommittees and the applicant with responses identified unless de-identification is specifically requested.
