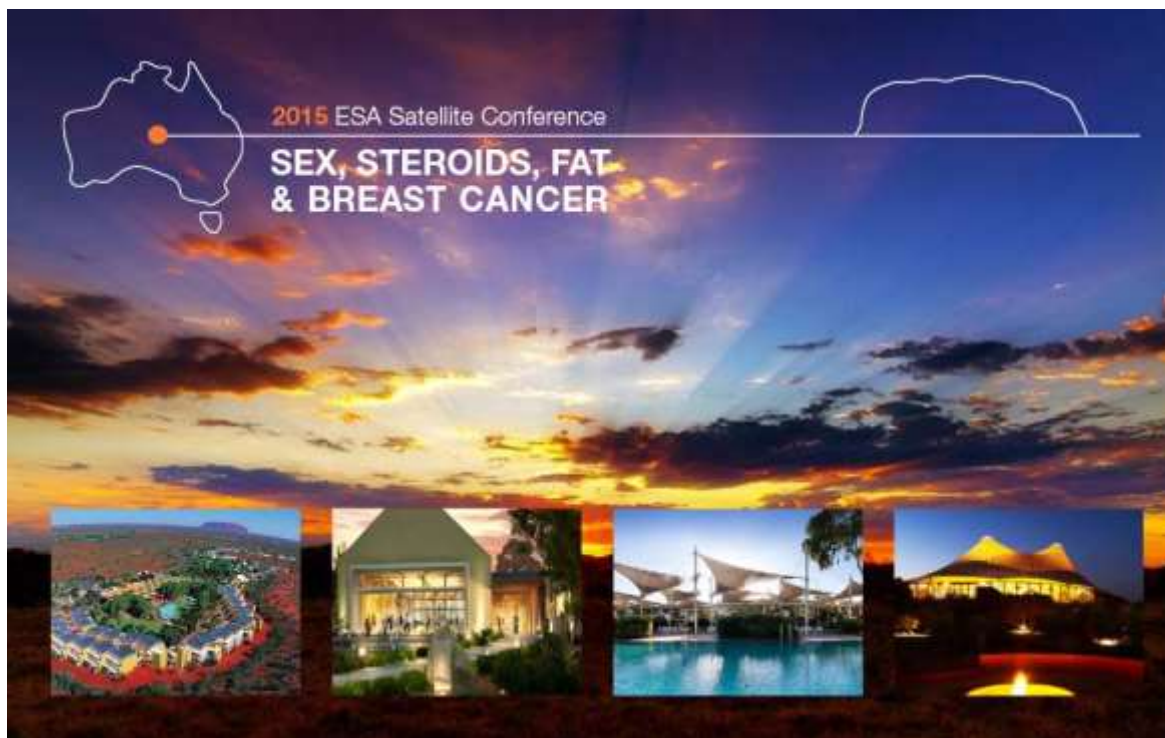
If your dues are not paid you will not be eligible to apply for membership registration fees and awards for the forthcoming ESA meetings.

Thyreporter Assay for Thyroid stimulating immunoglobulins

The Thyretain thyroid stimulating immunoglobulin (TSI) Thyreporter assay is a new bio-assay for those TSH receptor antibodies that stimulate the thyroid cell in patients with Graves disease. This assay is more specific and sensitive than the old TSH receptor binding assay (e.g. measured as TRAB) and has a particular advantage in that TSI Thyreporter more levels correlate closely with the presence and severity of any associated ophthalmopathy; the antibodies appear to be markers for the orbital inflammation, if not its cause. The TSI assay is a live cell bioassay and this is another reason why it is more specific for the autoimmune reactions in Graves disease and Graves ophthalmopathy. This assay will be set up in our laboratory at Nepean Clinical School (University of Sydney) in Kingswood, NSW and offered as a clinical test for endocrinologists, ophthalmologists and other practitioners throughout Australia. The TSI assay will supplement our eye muscle antibody program. This is a private test and there will be a fee of \$50.00 for the test which will be used to support our thyroid eye disease research.

Serum samples should be sent frozen on dry ice, to the Thyroid Research Laboratory, Level 5 South Block, Nepean Hospital in Kingswood NSW. This test is at present non-reimbursable although an effort will be made for this to be included in the MBS system, possibly replacing the TRAB assay.

The assay will be set up over the next few months and made available for clinical use throughout the country towards the end of the year. The TSI Thyreporter bioassay is not available elsewhere in Australia or New Zealand.
