

The Pharmaceutical Benefits Advisory Committee (PBAC) intends to establish a Reference Group to conduct a postmarket **review of Ezetimibe**, in terms of its cost-effectiveness in the context of the latest available evidence and best clinical practice.

All post-market reviews follow a standard process detailed in the Post-market Review Framework, available at: <u>http://www.pbs.gov.au/info/reviews/subsidised-medicines-reviews</u>. The Reference Groups will provide clinical, technical, consumer and industry advice to inform the reviews. Please see the attached Expression of Interest (EOI) form for further information.

The College has been invited to nominate a representative to participate in this review and, therefore, requests that you circulate this expression of interest to your membership. You may have already been approached by the PBAC on this matter, but we would like to seek expressions of interest from Fellows of your society, who are also members of the RACP. Concurrently, we will also seek expressions of interest from our Policy Reference Group members.
