Attitudes to HRT survey

In the decade since publication of the Women's Health Initiative study there has been a decline in the use of hormone replacement therapy (HRT) and ongoing debate regarding the perceived indications, benefits and risks of HRT. Differences in attitudes to HRT and prescribing practices has been observed between different medical specialists overseas but has not been assessed in Australia.

In this context, Women's Public Health Research, Monash Centre for Health Research and Implementation, School of Public Health and Preventive Medicine, Monash University are conducting a short (5-10 minute) survey of Australian health professionals regarding their attitudes to and prescribing of HRT and would greatly appreciate your contribution.
