

ESA President's Report - Professor Peter Ebeling

The ESA Council has had a very busy past 12 months and there has been much progress on all fronts:

New ESA logo and website:

A new ESA logo has been developed, while the ESA website has been completely remodeled to incorporate the new Society identity represented by the new ESA logo. As well as a new look, greater functionality has also been incorporated. "Find an endocrinologist" is one such example whereby endocrinologists can add their name if they would like to be contacted via the ESA website for patient referrals in specific sub-disciplines of endocrinology.

Successful Scientific Meetings:

The ESA Annual Scientific Meeting at the Melbourne Convention and Exhibition Centre from August 24-27, 2014 attracted 706 registrant thanks to the outstanding programme developed by Associate Professor Ann McCormack and her team. Professor Sundeep Khosla from the Mayo Clinic and Foundation delivered the Harrison Lecture, entitled "Sex steroids, bone and fat in men: the key role of estrogen", while Professor John Wass from the University of Oxford presented the Taft Lecture "Translational ans clinical science in the optimum management of pituitary tumours". Professor Benita Katzenellenbogen, from University of Illinois and College of Medicine, presented her work on "Estrogen receptor signaling networks", Kevin Grove delivered a plenary on "Programming metabolic and psychiatric diseases: Effects of poor maternal diet and health", and Adrian Clark, from St. George's University of London, on "Dissecting the genetic basis of inherited adrenocortical failure".

The ESA Seminar Meeting in May 2014, Hobart, Tasmania on the theme of adrenocortical disease had 280 attendees.

The ESA Clinical Weekend in August 2014, Torquay, Victoria had 294 attendees. The two winners will be fast-tracked for submission for publication as case reports in Clinical Endocrinology (Oxford).

Successful Finances:

ESA assets are now in a very healthy state with \$2.102 million (the Wynn Research Fund contains \$587,000).

ESA now awards one ESA Research Fellowship, one ESA Research Scholarship, and one Wynn Research Grant-in-Aid (each of one year duration). As a result of our healthy finances, ESA Council now proposes two *new* ESA grants: one ESA/RACP Fellowship; and one ESA Research Scholarship (each of one year duration).

RACP Alliances:

The HWA endocrinology workforce data are inaccurate as they lack ambulatory setting projections. We plan to liaise with the RACP and State Governments to increase the number of AT positions in Endocrinology. For example, in Victoria, NSW, SA and Queensland in 2014, 175 BPTs applied for 38 APT positions in endocrinology (a ratio of ~4.5 to 1).

The CEN Educational Modules

In 2013, the Endocrine Society of Australia joined the Society for Endocrinology (UK) in adopting Clinical Endocrinology (CEN) as their Society's official journal.

This was a stimulus for the Editors to activate an initiative, which had been planned for 2 years to "unlock the educational potential" of the Journal. Although the Journal's Impact factor (currently 3.4) remains the key benchmark, the Editors believe that articles published in a Society's clinical journal should also be tailored for continuing education and specialist training.

CEN Educational modules are based on articles which are in press or recently published in CEN. The module expands the paper into a topic by including:

Revision Material to provide background, Take Home messages to emphasise the clinical points, Expert Commentary to integrate the material from the article into the current literature - useful for preparation of Journal Club presentations. Multiple Choice Questions (using FRACP format and standard) to test understanding of the module content.

Historical Context to provide a broader understanding of the Art and History of Endocrinology. The modules identify the components of the RACP and RCP's curricula which are covered by the module and each module has clearly defined Learning Objectives. On completion of the module, a printed certificate documenting time spent on the module can be downloaded for CPD purposes.

Each module is written by either an advanced trainee or a consultant endocrinologist with an interest in the particular topic from Australia or the UK. The module is then reviewed by an expert in the field to ensure balance and validity of the material. Stephen Judd is the CEN senior editor, overseeing the project.
