

The CEN Educational Modules

In 2013, the Endocrine Society of Australia joined the Society for Endocrinology (UK) in adopting Clinical Endocrinology (CEN) as their Society's official journal.

This was a stimulus for the Editors to activate an initiative, which had been planned for 2 years to "unlock the educational potential" of the Journal. Although the Journal's Impact factor (currently 3.4) remains the key benchmark, the Editors believe that articles published in a Society's clinical journal should also be tailored for continuing education and specialist training.

CEN Educational modules are based on articles which are in press or recently published in CEN. The module expands the paper into a topic by including:

Revision Material to provide background, Take Home messages to emphasise the clinical points, Expert Commentary to integrate the material from the article into the current literature - useful for preparation of Journal Club presentations. Multiple Choice Questions (using FRACP format and standard) to test understanding of the module content.

Historical Context to provide a broader understanding of the Art and History of Endocrinology. The modules identify the components of the RACP and RCP's curricula which are covered by the module and each module has clearly defined Learning Objectives. On completion of the module, a printed certificate documenting time spent on the module can be downloaded for CPD purposes.

Each module is written by either an advanced trainee or a consultant endocrinologist with an interest in the particular topic from Australia or the UK. The module is then reviewed by an expert in the field to ensure balance and validity of the material. Stephen Judd is the CEN senior editor, overseeing the project. He welcomes feedback on the modules and invites anyone interested in writing a module to contact him.

The conference will bring together leading Diabetes specialists from Australia and the Asia Pacific region. The event is being hosted and supported by Monash University and in particular The Faculty of Pharmacy and Pharmaceutical Sciences. The conference has been endorsed by the Australian Wound Management Association, the Advanced Practicing Podiatrists High Risk Foot Group and Diabetes Australia.

The comprehensive program will examine all major aspect of Diabetes and in particular the Diabetic foot. Topics that will be covered by both Australian and invited overseas speakers will include:

- Diabetes a major regional issue
- Vascular interventions in Diabetes
- Infection a growing risk in the Diabetic
- Pain and the Diabetic
- Orthopaedic surgical issue
- Plastic and reconstruction surgery
- Nutrition and Diabetes
- Regional perspectives in the growth of Diabetes
- The major role of podiatry in the prevention and management of the Diabetic foot
- Cutting edge new science in the use of markers for Diabetic wound healing
- New treatments for charcot foot

The Conference will also expose the delegates to two workshops on Diabetic Foot Assessment and new methods of offloading the Diabetic foot. These will be conducted on both days of the conference to allow as many registrants to attend the workshops. The conference will invite submissions of both oral presentations and posters, with prizes offered for the best oral presentation by a young investigator and the best poster.

The Asia Pacific Association for Diabetic Limb Problems was formed ten years ago by a small group of health professionals in Singapore and regional countries to help educate and understand the disease and how best to treat the consequences of Diabetic limb injury. The Association holds a meeting each year in a different country in the region bringing together health professionals working in the area. The conference will bring together both leading Australians and also leaders from the region including India, Malaysia, Indonesia, Philippines, Taiwan, Sri Lanka, Hong Kong, New Zealand, China and Singapore. The conference is a unique opportunity to bring together regional health professional, with their Australian colleagues and will hopefully provide a vehicle for on-going collaborations.
