In addition to commissioning specific articles for the issue, they are also inviting unsolicited manuscripts for submission on any topic within the field of Endocrinology, and in any of their prescribed manuscript formats including research, guidelines, systematic reviews, perspectives and clinical focus articles. Manuscripts can be any of the article types listed on their Instructions for Authors page (available at <https://www.mja.com.au/journal/mja-instructions-authors-types-articles-published-mja>), including research, guidelines, short reports, perspectives, for debate and reflections. It should be noted that there will only be scope for a limited number of manuscripts across all areas of endocrinology in this single issue of MJA.

Manuscripts should be submitted by 20 April 2016.

Nominations for ESA Council 2016-2020

Nominations are now called for election to membership of the Council of the Endocrine Society of Australia.

Council members reaching the end of their terms in 2016 are Helena Teede (who will stay on for the next year in the role of past-president), Tim Cole, Ashim Sinha and Morton Burt. These members can stand for re-election if they wish.

Warrick Inder will take on the role of President for two years, then past-president for one year.

Therefore, in the 2016 election, those elected will stay on ESA Council for 4 years until 2020. At least 4 states must be represented on the Committee.

Nominees must be a financial member of the Society, and be nominated by two financial members of ESA. The primary requirement of a committee member is an interest in assisting with the work of ESA in promoting endocrine research and practice in Australia.

Criteria for ESA Life Membership:

- Age over 55.
- Member of ESA for 25 years or more.
- May have served on ESA Council, but have been off Council for a minimum of 2 years.
- Has made an outstanding contribution to research or clinical practice in the field of endocrinology in Australia.
- Is recognised as a high quality mentor/teacher through either supervision of higher degree candidates and/or clinical advanced training in endocrinology.

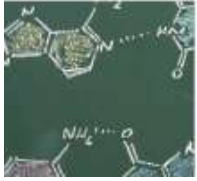

The Endocrine Society of Australia have established an international collaboration with the US Endocrine Society to adapt patient information to the Australian setting and make them readily available.

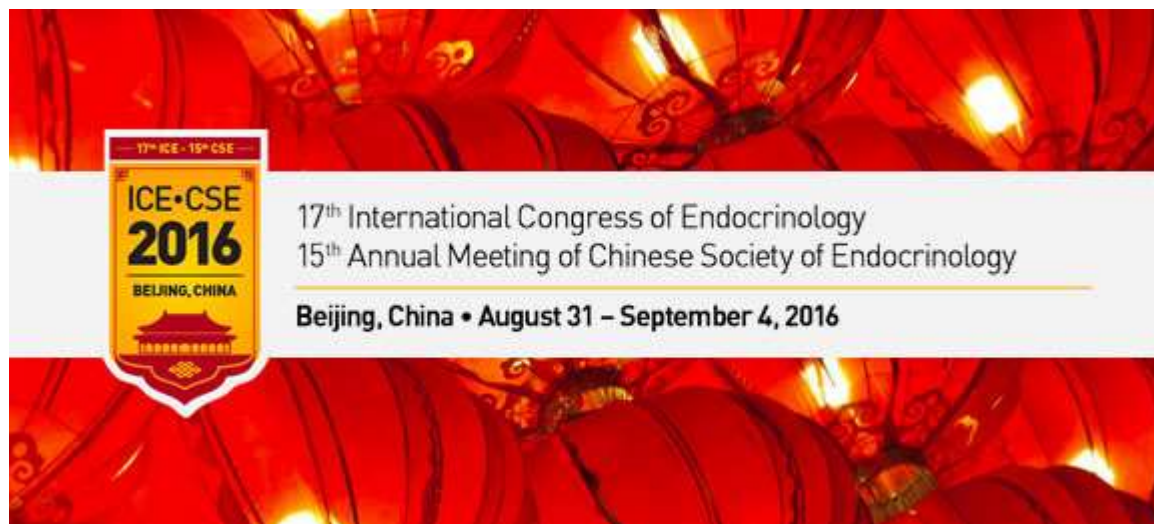

Multilanguage resources to help people with diabetes

New research conducted by Diabetes Australia (DA) and the Australian Diabetes Educators Association (ADEA) suggests that people with diabetes need more relevant information to equip them to manage their condition during and after an emergency.

The new resources are profiled in a stakeholder action kit, which was jointly developed by DA and ADEA to provide emergency preparedness information for organisations that help people with diabetes.

Information in the kit is evidence-based and was tested with health professionals and people with diabetes from five of Australia’s major language groups: English, Arabic, Turkish, Vietnamese and Chinese (simplified and traditional).

Resources for people with diabetes include the My Diabetes Plan and the Managing Your Diabetes in an Emergency flyer. Both are available in five languages. The kit also includes information for medical and emergency services about the effects of emergency situations on people with diabetes.
