ESA have been advised from Janssen-Cilag Pty Ltd that all supplies of canagliflozin (Invokana) 100 mg and 300 mg will cease from approximately October 2016. Canagliflozin was removed from the PBS in August 2015. Any patients still on this medication should be changed to an alternative.
