Registrations are now open for the 2017 Diagnostic Error Qstream Course

Diagnosis is one of the most difficult cognitive tasks in medicine; it is also the first step in informing clinical management decisions.

The objectives of this course include:

- To enhance understanding of decision making during diagnosis in complex clinical environments
- To increase understanding of potential system and cognitive factors that can impact accurate diagnostic decision making within clinical practice
- To learn methods to identify, learn from and reduce diagnostic errors in clinical practice.

This version of the Diagnostic Error Qstream Course has been modified based on participant feedback from the first two courses run in 2016. The revised course includes an emphasis on critical thinking and self-reflection. There will also be greater opportunity for peer-to-peer learning with other participants.

The course is free and will run from late March to May. It takes as little as five minutes a day, two to three times a week to complete via email.
