PhD position available – Garvan Institute of Medical Research, Sydney

A new PhD position is available within the Division of Diabetes and Metabolism, in the Group for 'Personalised Medicine in Diabetes Care'. The project will involve two main areas. One is to find predictors of responders and non-responders to certain oral anti-hyperglycaemic agents for improving the individualisation of diabetes care. A second area will be to screen for so far undiagnosed monogenic forms of diabetes, patients often misdiagnosed as having type 1 or type 2 diabetes, and to demonstrate whether the diagnosis of a genetic form of diabetes has an impact on their treatment, glycaemic control and quality of life.

The project would involve conducting clinical research with a strong link to the genome sequencing and bioinformatics facilities.

The project is most suitable for applicants with a clinical background, and with an interest in diabetes and endocrinology. Applicants are expected to secure full scholarship funding and gain admission to the UNSW Australia Postgraduate Program. Start date would be preferable July 2014.
